Teaching and learning should show progression across all key stages During each Key Stage 1 pupils are taught knowledge, skills and understanding through learning about Christianity and Buddhism. In Key Stage 2 pupils are taught knowledge, skills and understanding through learning about Christianity, Hinduism and Sikhism. All RE is based on knowledge and understanding of religion, critical thinking and personal reflection.</p>	<p>Children will achieve age related expectations in RE at the end of their cohort year.</p> <p>Children will retain knowledge that is relevant to RE.</p> <p>Children will have the opportunity to meet people from different faiths so developing an understanding of other people's cultures and ways of life. This is proving to be invaluable in an ever changing and shrinking world.</p>
